Committee Reports:

1. First Families: One applicant needs to be reviewed.

Old Business:

1. 2018 Calendars are ready to be picked up. They are \$5 each as they were in recent years.
2. The plans for the Apple Festival are to have a table at the Jackson Historical Society booth on Saturday and have a table at the museum with handouts during the week.
3. The James Cemetery Historical Marker is leaning and the city has taken the responsibility to straighten it and pay for any needed materials. Also the city will clean the cemetery of the barrels and piles of dirt.
4. The James Cemetery plaque to acknowledge Anthony Coyan's work at the cemetery will cost \$200 for an engraved granite stone to be epoxied to a column at the entrance. We need to be sure the plan is OK with the city. Beverly will check on it.

New Business:

1. There was a more extended discussion of an overhead scanner for scanning documents and books. There are basically two models that look comparable and would be adequate for our use. Charles will do further research into which model looks best for our purposes. Based on previous research, a motion was made by Larry to spend up to \$700 on a machine.

2. We will need to nominate Officers next month (October).
