PERSONAL REMINISCENCES.

Last week's Jackson Standard has the following which we extract from an article headed "The Whirligig of Time:"

"Emily Harvey had a half brother who was about my age. His name was Elgin McAtee. There was a wild, romantic place on the Black Fork of Symmes Creek, about a mile from where my father lived. It was known as the Grassy Beaver Pond. In the summer there were great quantities of blackberries in this place. One Sunday forenoon I was there for berries, and there were fifteen or twenty others there. Among them were several of my cousins, young men. I think Solomon Mackley, jr., was there, and his brothers, Andrew and Jesse; old Jesse Corn, the hardshell Baptist preacher, and his brother Jim, and his sisters Lucy and Hannah, and others. Lucy and Hannah Corn commenced taunting Elgin McAtee, and, boy like, he retorted. The Corn girls became insulted and told their big brothers that Elgin had "sassed" them. Jesse Corn got a big switch and caught Elgin by the arm. He did not strike him, but he raved and yelled at him so that he could have been heard a half mile.

CORN.—At his residence in Lawrence township, this county, on August 5th, 1875, Rev. Jesse Corn, aged 79 years.

He was born in North Carolina January 19th, 1796; he has lived in this county 45 years; has been a preacher of the Gospel in the Regular Baptist Church 50 years. He was a highly esteemed minister and citizen of this community, liked by all classes whether religious or not. He died in the triumph of Faith—that he was exchanging the cross of Christ for a crown of glory. He leaves a widow, many children and relatives, and a world of warm friends to mourn his departure.

Our 21st year of publication begins with this issue. For our lead article James L. Murphy, Reference Librarian of the Ohio Historical Society, Inc. has compiled obituaries and marriage records from the Logan (Hocking County) newspapers. He has collected the information from the available issues through 1867, including obituaries and notices of the appointment of executors and administrators of estates. Published notices often give additional information that the marriage records usually available at the probate court do not contain. Mr. Murphy is to be admired and congratulated for his exhaustive and careful research. His series of 1850 mortality schedules is to be continued this year.

Eleven years ago Mrs. Esther Weygandt Powell gave her periodical, OHIO RECORDS AND PIONEER FAMILIES, to the present editor with the understanding that all profits from its publication be given to the Ohio Genealogical Society for its library. From the subscription monies only printing and mailing costs are taken. The Editor and contributing editors donate their material and time, Mrs. Powell still contributes heavily to the published material.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

In OR&PF Vol. XV:182 concerning Lawrence County, Ohio, Pioneer Families, I want to point out a number of errors found in the Mason Township section for Corn family members. For substantiation I have included a xerox copy of the 1887 Hardest Atlas. My family is descended from the George Corn mentioned. Thomas Higgins my g grandfather m Hannah Corn. He was brother to the Margaret Higgins who m James Corn. Brother and sister Higgins, children of John and Margaret (Dennison) Higgins m brother and sister Corn, children of George and Dollie (Literal) Corn. The article should read as follows:

CORN, JAMES, b Patrick Co., Va., 11-22-1808, son of George and Dollie (LITERAL) CORN who went to Bunkum (Buncombe) Co., N.C. in 1812 and to Jackson Co., O. in 1814 where the father d in 1829 (#1). The widow came to Lawrence Co. James m in 1829 Margaret HIGGINS b Cabell Co., W. Va., 10-5-1819 (#2), dau of John and Margaret (Dennison) Higgins, settled here in 1838 from Greenbrier Co., W. Va., (#3). James & Margaret had 15 ch.

- #1 This date is incorrect, though listed by Hardesty. The Jackson Co. Deed bk B p. 34 shows a deed 8 May 1830 signed by George Corn.
- #2 This date though listed by Hardesty is incorrect and should read 1809. The family had moved to Ohio by 1819 for they did not appear in the 1815 Cabell Co. Census. Also Margaret would have been ten years old when married.
- #3 It is not clear what Hardesty meant by this date. John and Margaret were on Sandfork Creek soon after 1816 when Burlington became the Lawrence Co. Court House. Their children were being married in Lawrence Co., O. before 1820.

CORN, HARVEY b 9-4-1827, son of Wm. & Mary (MASIE) Corn (#4).

- #4 There should be no "s" for these CORN family member names. The Wm. mentioned here was also a son of the above George Corn.
