His parents removed to Scioto County when he was about eleven years of age. His father died there in 1828. Our subject left home early and came to Jackson to work at the Salt Works. Among other things, he hauled wood for the Salt Furnace of Judge William Swens who used the water from the old well still to be found near the Baker building.

Mr. McLain was married in 1824, Justice Samuel McDowell, the first Justice elected in this county after its organization, and after whom McDowell's Run was named, performing the ceremony.

Mrs. McLain was born May 21st, 1804, in Jefferson County Ohio, and was thus a few weeks older than her husband.

Fourteen children were born to them all of whom grew to maturity and ten of whom survive. The dead are James the oldest son who was killed by a train at Springfield about three years ago; Rebecca the wife of Rev. James Coon; Nancy who was the second wife of the same; and Guy the wife of G. W. Sprigg. She died in the west about six years ago.

The living children are Ann wife of Isaac Ammons of Michigan; Sarah wife of Rev. William Crabtree of Pike County; Rachel wife of John Tope of this city. Susan wife of Charles Gray of Cass County, Missouri; Delilah wife of John Pierce of Allen Co.; William living in Mercer County; Peter and Daniel living in Scioto; Samuel living in Colorado and Benjamin who is living at the old home.

THE HAMILTON CHURCH, Hamilton Township, Jackson Co. Ohio

"The Hamilton Christian Church was first organized by Elder John Swim, Jonathan Bryant, and Joseph Baker in the year 1836 with the following members. This church took membership in the Ohio Salt Creek Christian Conference."

Among members listed were Andrew Fleming, Elder; William Martain, Deacon; Bonapart Fleming, Deacon; Michael McCoy, James Wells, Levi M. Mercer, John Canter, Sen., John Martin, Solomon Canter, Enoch Canter, John Canter, Jr., Elizabeth E. McCoy (Mercer), Mary Wells, Sen., (Nance), Mary Wells, Jr., (Bradburn), Mahala Fleming (Mercer), Belinda Mercer (Cantwell), Barbara Canter (Walls), Sarah Canter, Sen., Sarah Canter, Jr., Melinda Canter (Walls). Loretta Martin, Mary Canter (Comer), Eva Canter (Comer), America Martin, Christina Martin, Nancy Martin, Juliana Canter.

This above quotation is from the existing church book and records the origin of the present Hamilton Church. At that time no church building had been erected and meetings were held in the school. This was a log building standing on land owned by John Walls. In 1842 the church moved to the new McCoy School, also of logs, erected on land owned by Michael McCoy in Section 11, This location on which no buildings remain, is one half mile up the valley to the north of the residence of M.A. McCoy.

The church re-organized in 1843, John Aldridge, Elder; Michael McCoy and Solomon Canter, Deacons. Etc.
