Riley Corn, eldest son of James and Melly (Vernon) Corn, was born in Jackson Co., O. May 28, 1827. His father was born in Patrick Co., Va. Sept. 28, 1804 and his mother in Stokes, N. C. June 11, 1805. They were married in Jackson Co., O., where their parents had been removed about 1811, and had a family of 9 children, 8 of whom grew to maturity. His mother died Oct. 10, 1878. His father still lives in Gallia Co., Ohio. Riley was reared on a farm, but being desirous of ^{an} education studied evenings and when 19 yrs. of age was qualified to teach. He taught 25 terms, 8 in his own school district. Since then he has been engaged in farming. In 1856 he purchased an interest in the Limestone Iron Co., retaining his interest till the furnace closed. In 1859 he was elected Clerk of Blainfield Twp., and held the office till 1865, when he refused to serve, but in 1866 was again elected, serving till 1878. In June, 1865

was elected Justice of the Peace and
 lived 6 years. Apr. 18, 1860 he married
 Fennina, daughter of Albert and Abigail
 (Patten) Wood. They have 5 children 3 sons
 and 2 daughters.

settled. Susannah and husband, Enoch Ewing, moved to Hillsdale County, Michigan, in 1853.

Finally, descendants Jordan and William Radabaugh enlisted as soldiers in the 36th Regiment of O.V.I. during the Civil War along with Silas, William, and James Arthur.

The Yeager Pioneer Family

A marriage license bond issued to Phillip Yeager and Barbary Nichlas 6 Feb 1794 was co-signed by Peter Arbogast and John Monahan of Bath County, Virginia, later Greenbrier County, West Virginia.

The Yeagers came to Jackson County, Ohio, ca 1817-1818 as there was a deed transfer between John Correll as the buyer, and Phillip and Barbara Yeager, the sellers, in Greenbrier County, dated 12 Sept 1817, recorded in Deed Book #6, page 350. The deed conveyance was completed on a total of 125 acres on Culber-son Creek for the sum of five shillings.

The Yeager children include: (1) Sarah, born 8 Jan 1895, (2) Mary, born 7 July 1896, (3) George, born 25 Feb 1898, (4) Elizabeth, born 2 Apr 1899; (5) Hannah, born 6 Oct 1800, (6) John, born 23 Oct 1801, (7) Rebecca, born 8 Jan 1806, (8) Henry, born 11 May 1804, (9) Isabel, born 18 Jan 1808, (10) Samuel, born 9 Nov 1810, (11) Hester, born 23 May 1813, (12) Ann, born 10 Oct 1815, (13) Matilda, born 15 June 1818, (14) Andrew, born 20 June 1820, and (15) William James born 7 Nov 1822, as taken from the Yeager Family Bible in the possession of Mary Jenkins.

William James Yeager married Cynthia Arthur and named one of their sons Benjamin McKendree Yeager (the McKendree was from the Arthur family), and Isabel married Captain James Johnson from near Camba or Irwin's Station.

Phillip and Barbara Yeager's land in Franklin Township (Range 18, Section 35) was located midway between Clay and Camba. Phillip's will (written 2 Sep 1843) Will Book A, pp. 84-85, leaves real estate of about 80 acres to son William in exchange for "furnishing clothing for different seasons of the year and provisions suitable for our age and health for our natural lives." The will was entered for probate 17 Sep 1847; therefore, Phillip died after 2 Sep 1843 and before 1847. It is not known when Barbara died, but both are buried in Jenkins Cemetery.

Further information on the Yeagers is in the will of Joel C. Arthur whose two sisters, Margaret and Syntha married Yeagers. Will Book A, page 430.
