Thank you for the lovely letter in answer to my request sent to the Jackson City Library. Thank you, too, for the invitation to join your Genealogical Society. Enclosed is my check to the Society for the Annual Dues. Also, my thanks to someone who sent me a newsletter which I enjoyed,

I think the searching of the members' five generation sheets is excellent and will certainly appreciate anyone's finding some connection to the family.

My enclosed five generation sheet is a bit messy and I am sorry but I could find only one I had started a long time ago; am completely out of forms so will have to send for some. Attached to the sheet is a family group sheet showing Samuel's family; I feel that this is his second marriage and second family due to various age differences between him and his wife, and between his daughter Susannah, my ancestress, and his first child shown on the group sheet.

Enclosed, also, is my check for \$14. I cannot take advantage of help when I have just joined. I need so very much a list of the Jackson Cemeteries so that I can try to get the interment records on both Samuel and Jane. Then, I need to know if he or they made any land transactions. The 1870 Census shows him as the Auditor of Jackson County, his son William as Deputy Auditor. Samuel shows Real Estate \$1,000 and Personal Property valued at \$1,500.

I have checked and there is no will for either Samuel or Jane. There is one for the Abraham Baker you mentioned and I sent for it. *more about it.*

Am not sure just how to make out the check for the searching but will make it to the Society and, if it is wrong, will send another. Also, \$14 may not be enough so please have the searcher let me know.

Dear Mrs. Hixon:

Thank you for the letter of April 26. I am returning a check made out to you; I wasn't sure who received the proceeds -- the searcher or the Genealogical Society -- when I made out the other.

I know that being President of an active organization takes a lot of one's time so if my work is a burden, we will put it off until later or until someone else is available. Will leave it up to you.

I knew the death date of Samuel Baker as I had received a copy of his Death Certificate a few days ago; I am expecting his wife Jane's any day now. I also have a list of the Baker Wills so don't bother with them. Incidentally, neither Samuel nor Jane had a will even though the Census showed he had property and personal property of value.

Was surprised and very interested to receive the Comer information. Am sorry that you had to copy it all by hand. I haven't worked on my Comer line for a couple of years as the female line is difficult to trace and takes so much time. You see, I am 79 years old and have only one eye with any vision so had to sort of get on a straight acendency or descendency basis. I did not have that information so will put it in the Comer binder but would appreciate it if you would send me the name of the book or article and the author and date in which you found it. I try to document every bit of information I find or use. Incidentally, my great grandmother Mary Jane Comer and my great grandfather Abraham Snedegar are in the U. B. Cemetery in Oak Hill not too far from you. I have some excellent pictures of their tombstones.

Was disappointed when I read that Samuel has no tombstone in the Fairmont Cemetery. Is it in Jackson? Is Jane buried there, too?

I noticed in the Newsletter that a ^{Index to} Jackson County Atlas was for sale. Does it show any land ownership? *Would like to know more about it.*

If there are any members descending from the Baker family, I would be happy to have their names and addresses so I could write to them.

The thing I need the most right now is a list of the land transactions from the Recorder's Office. The Grantee - Grantor list of the Baker Family only. If you can do that for me it would be a big help as I could write for copies of the documents; or, if you found any pertaining to Samuel, perhaps you could get the copies and I will pay you for them. It would be quicker that way.

Would love to see your books as you must have done a long, hard job. Our Library interchange here is not so great due to a big Tax Cut about three years ago. We live in a very small town and it is too far to go to San Francisco for any research even if we knew the books were there. *I thank you for your letter. I send my regards + good wishes.
