## YELLOWED NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS

It's the acidity in newspaper print that causes newspaper clippings to turn yellow. You can avoid it by soaking them in a simple solution that will give the paper a long-lasting alkaline resistance to the acidity.

Four tablespoons of milk of magnesia mixed in a quart of club soda will do the job. Dip the clippings carefully into the solution and then spread them over some sort of supporting material like a sheet of plastic or some nylon netting until most of the moisture has dripped off. Then dry the clipping between sheets of white blotting paper under the weight of a stack of books. Paper towels cannot be substituted for blotting paper because of their irregular surface.
