They first settled in Ross county, but finding the area too wet, they moved in 1812 to Jackson county and located on land southeast of Jackson, near Madison Furnace. It is said they were heading for the Dayton area but met families fleeing that area due to Cholera so they stopped in Ross county. The current Madison Furnace-Callaghan graveyard, in the Cooper Hollow Wildlife Area, is located on the edge of the homestead, part of the graveyard being donated by the old McLaughlin family.
