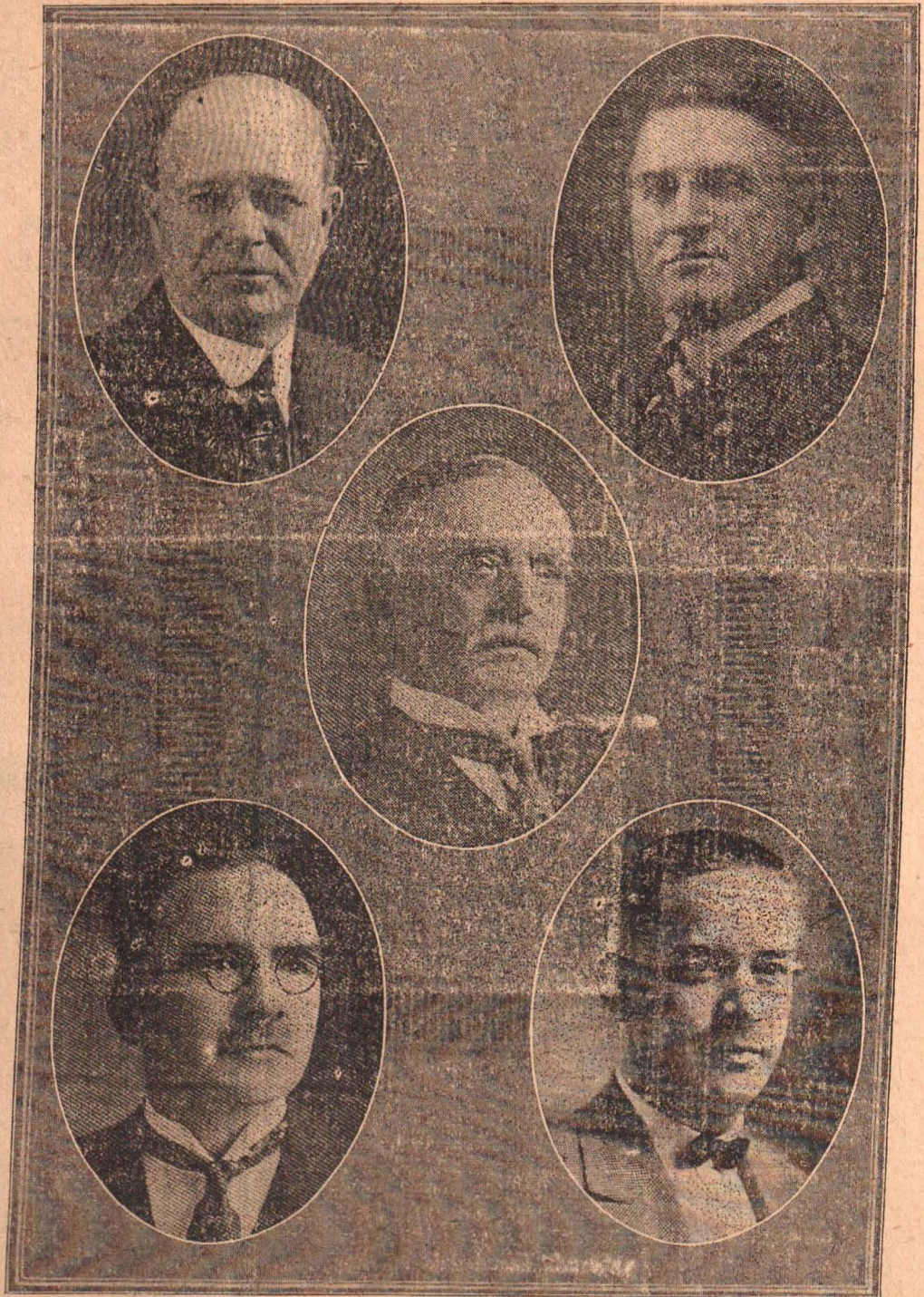

SILAS E. BROOKINS PASSES AWAY HERE SUNDAY AFTERNOON

Member of Well Known
Family Dies at Age of
75 Years.

WAS ILL LONG TIME

Another of Jackson's older citizens passed away late Sunday afternoon when Silas E. Brookins died after a long illness. Mr. Brookins was 75 years of age.

He was born near Trimble, in Athens County, in 1849, the son of Eleazor and Hannah S. Brookins. He came to Jackson in 1863 and has been a resident of Jackson County ever since.

Mr. Brookins has been an active worker in the Christian Church at Jackson all of his life. He became a member of the church when 14 years of age, and for a long time, has been an elder in the church.

On Christmas Day, 1869, he was married to Naomi Gibson, by Rev. Backus. Three children were born of the marriage, two of them dying while children. One son, Isaac J. Brookins, of Jackson, survives with the mother, and one foster daughter, Mrs. Maude Caldwell, of Columbus.

Two brothers, I. B. Brookins and C. A. Brookins, survive, both living in Jackson.

The deceased has been an active member of Salt Lick Lodge 417 I. O. O. F. since 1884, and of Jackson Encampment 144 since 1887.

He has engaged in a number of business enterprises in this city. For a time he was in the furniture business, and at the time of his death he had a grocery store at his home in Jamestown.

Funeral services were held from the Christian Church Tuesday afternoon, Rev. I. N. Grisso officiating. John Thomas, funeral director, was in charge of interment.
