# CHAS. M. WHALEY FORMER RESIDENT CALLED SATURDAY

## Body of Former Jackson Man Brought Back for Burial.

### WAS 53 YEARS OLD

Charles M. Whaley, aged 53, an attendant at the State Hospital for the Feeble Minded at Orient, Ohio, died Saturday morning following an attack of pneumonia. He had been ill since Tuesday.

The body was taken to the home of his daughter Mrs. Grace Quinn at 551 Kimball Place, Columbus. Monday morning the remains were brought to Jackson to the home of his brother Jeff Whaley, on State street, by undertakers Cook & Son of Columbus.

Funeral service will be held today at 10 a. m., at Wesley Chapel, with Rev. M. R. White of Lucasville officiating. Burial will be made in Mountain Ridge by Undertakers. Leist & Davis of Leaver.

Surviving Mr. Whaley are his widow, three daughters, Mrs. Grace Quinn and Mrs. Minnie Barr of Columbus and Miss Elva Whaley, teacher of the Poe Run School near Richondale; and one son Charles Carl of Columbus. He is also survived by the late brother, Jeff Whaley of Jackson, two sisters, Mrs. Anise Bryant of Jackson County, and Mrs. Myrta Fout of Springfield.

The deceased was born in Jackson county, and was a resident of Liberty township until about seven years ago. He had been a school teacher, and had served his township as land appraiser, assessor, and clerk.

His daughter, Miss Elva Whaley is at the home of her friends, Mr. and Mrs. Otto Flaker at Cove when news reached her of her father's death. Her brother Carl had come down to Jackson early Saturday morning on a hunting trip. He and his sister left immediately for Columbus.

# JOHN JAMES, 81 CALLED SATURDAY

## Civil War Veteran Dies Af- ter Long Illness.

John James, aged nearly 82 years, passed away Saturday morning at the home of his daughter Mrs. John Thomas on Pearl Street. Mr. James was a veteran of the Civil War. He has been ill for many months.

Surviving are three daughters and two sons, Mrs. R. W. Parry of Cincinnati; Mrs. John Thomas of Jackson; Mrs. H. C. White of Washington, D. C.; William James of Cincinnati; James James of Jackson. Twelve grandchildren also survive.

Funeral services were held from the Welsh Presbyterian Church Tuesday afternoon. Rev. J. W. Mathews, the pastor, was assisted by Rev. Lloyd, a nephew of the deceased, in conducting the service. Interment was made in Fairmount.
